Course Overview

CDCP Course is an intensive course which encompasses theories and practical experience in dementia care. The 80-hours course involves lecture, class practice, case discussion, practical session and continuous assessment. Students will be equipped as Certified Dementia Care Planner and perform care planning to people living with dementia and their caregivers in multi-disciplinary approach.

The course is suitable to colleagues with 1-2 years of working experience specifically in Dementia Care.

Upon completion of the course, students will be equipped as a Certified Dementia Care Planner and able to:

- ▶ Understand the pathology, symptoms and characteristics, classifications of Dementia and updated intervention approaches
- ▶ Coordinating supports for people with dementia and their families with different caring teams in community, residential and/or hospital services
- ▶ Be competent in assessment, care planning and case management process for Dementia
- ▶ Render support and advice to family caregivers along the caregiving journey
- ▶ Support and guide people with dementia and their families through the Advance Care Planning process

The course offers flexibility for participants to take full course or by module.

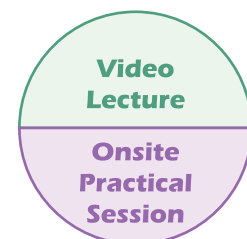

Teaching team

Multi-disciplinary professionals experienced in Dementia care service, such as experienced specialist medical practitioners (eg. Specialist in Psychiatry/ Specialist in Internal Medicine/ Physician), Social Worker, Lawyer, Occupational Therapist, Nurse, etc.

Mode of teaching

Lectures are conducted in Cantonese supplemented by English. Examination papers are in English with multiple choices and short questions. Depending on the latest pandemic situation or other unpredictable circumstances, the mode of course delivery might change to online class.
